The faculty and staff of Malashock Dance hold each other, the art of dance, and the respectability and value of the work we do in high regard. We expect all who participate in classes demonstrate a willingness to be held to the same standard. This includes but is not limited to the following:

RESPECT FOR ART

Dancers are on time to class

Dancers come to class compliant with dress code

Dancers give their best effort and have a positive attitude.

Dancers respect differing points of view and movement styles

RESPECT FOR OTHERS
